**Consultant for Architectural, Engineering and Construction Management**

The City of Moultrie, Georgia is requesting statements of qualifications and proposals from consultants with a strong record or qualifications which will enable it to successfully assist the local government with implementation of design and construction of a new Intermodal Facility to be located in downtown Moultrie, Georgia.

Moultrie seeks to immediately contract for consulting services for EDI Special Project Grant funds and Georgia Department of Transportation that will include architectural, engineering and construction management for the new Intermodal Facility. This project shall be completed in phases and the responding firms should be qualified to provide consultation and related services for a period of 2 - 3 years.

Criteria for evaluation includes (1) knowledge of EDI Special Project guidelines and regulations, (2) experience in design of this type project, (3) knowledge of community, (4) workload and ability to meet the project schedule, and (5) track record for successfully designing previous EDI Special Projects. Proposers shall also cite examples of similar work in other communities, and include references from within those communities. References will be contacted. All contracts are subject to Federal and State contract provisions prescribed by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
