1. Call to Order

Mayor McIntosh called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m.

2. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Council Member Clarke Hill gave the Invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Kenneth Wallace – came in opposition of the renovations to the NW Basketball Park and stated the money should be used in another park in Northwest Moultrie.

Valerie Alderman -1113 9th St SW- expressed opposition and safety concerns for the elderly living next to the NW Basketball Park. Ms. Alderman asked Mayor and Council to find another way to help the youth beside the NW Basketball Park.

6. City Manager's Report


City Manager Dillard reported that the City of Moultrie's Fire Chief and Fire Marshall are now designated as State Certified Fire Marshalls. Dillard stated that last year the City of Moultrie only has a 13% turnover rate compared to the City of Albany's 38% turn over rate. Dillard explained that the City was making an effort to get our firefighters EMT certified and one firefighter recently got certified as a paramedic.

7. Other Business



The Mayor asked Council to consider a Resolution authorizing the Athens Housing Authority to issue bonds to finance facilities located in the City of Moultrie contingent upon supporting document for Shy Manor Apartments. Council Member Clarke Hill made a motion to approve the resolution. Council Member Hadley seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. *Resolution R03-2020-06*
