

**MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION HELD BY MOULTRIE CITY COUNCIL  
ON TUESDAY, MAY 18, 2021 AT 5:30 P.M. IN THE COUNCIL CONFERENCE  
ROOM**

**MEMBERS PRESENT:** Mayor McIntosh, Council Members Barber, Dunn, Clarke Hill, Hadley, Ponder and Posey; City Manager Dillard, City Attorney Waller and City Clerk Coleman

**1) Call to Order**

Mayor McIntosh called the meeting to order at 5:32 p.m.

**2) Review Council Meeting Agenda Items**

City Manager Dillard reviewed the Council Meeting agenda items.

Discussion ensued about the July 6<sup>th</sup> Council meeting. After discussion, the consensus was to cancel the July 6<sup>th</sup> Council meeting.

City Manager Dillard gave an activity update on the Welcome Center.

**3) Executive Session**

Section 50-14-2(1) and to discuss the purchase, disposal of, or lease of property; authorize the ordering of an appraisal related to the acquisition or disposal of real estate; enter into a contract to purchase, dispose of, or lease property subject to approval in a subsequent public vote; or enter into an option to purchase, dispose of, or lease real estate subject to approval in subsequent public vote, which is excluded from the Open Meetings Act pursuant to Section 50-14-3(b)(1)(C). Council Member Hadley seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

**4) Open Meeting**

Council Member Barber moved to go back into Regular Session at 6:00 p.m. Council Member Clarke Hill seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. No action was taken.

**5) Other**

Discussion ensued concerning speed limits within the City. After discussion, the consensus was if the neighborhood could get a majority of residents to agree then the City would change the speed limit signs.

Mayor McIntosh asked if the City would start making contact with residents before trimming their trees.
