

**MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION HELD BY MOULTRIE CITY COUNCIL ON
TUESDAY, MAY 19, 2026 AT 5:30 P.M. IN THE COUNCIL CONFERENCE ROOM**

1. Call to Order

Mayor McIntosh called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m..

2. Review Council Meeting Agenda Items

City Manager Dillard reviewed the Council Meeting agenda items with the Mayor and Council.

City Manager Dillard explained that revisions had been made to the proposed parking ordinance to address situations involving vehicles parked directly in front of residential driveways and fire hydrants. The purpose of the changes was to help ensure emergency vehicles could access homes quickly and safely when needed.

Council Member Clarke Hill requested that additional research be conducted on similar parking ordinances adopted by other municipalities, including an evaluation of the potential benefits and drawbacks. Following extensive discussion regarding Agenda Item No. 19, the proposed parking ordinance, the Mayor and Council reached a consensus to remove the item from the agenda. As a result, no vote on the ordinance was taken during the Council Meeting.

3. Other

City Manager Dillard provided an update regarding the road closure near First Baptist Church. He stated that data related to the closure is expected shortly and will be presented to the Council.

The road closure primarily impacts the church's preschool, which serves children ages 1 to 4. The closure does not affect church services on Sundays; rather, the impact is concentrated during weekday operations, Monday through Friday. Additionally, with several local daycare facilities having recently closed, enrollment at the church preschool is expected to increase, potentially resulting in additional traffic and accessibility concerns.

Council Member Hadley inquired about the location of underground utilities within the affected area. Utilities Director Greg Monfort assured the Council that the necessary easements would be in place and that utility personnel would retain access to the

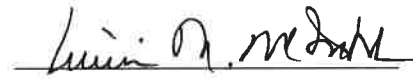
underground infrastructure, including water and sewer lines, should maintenance or repairs become necessary.
